Back verandahs on both levels with views & breezes over Yandina township and a plunge pool integrated into the verandah downstairs.

The home has three large bedrooms. Two upstairs and the parents retreat downstairs with ensuite and second living area. Main bathroom upstairs with separate toilet. Newly appointed laundry downstairs. Open-plan living upstairs with a combined kitchen, dining & lounge with air-con for the warmer months and a fire place for the cooler months. Newly installed polished timber floors throughout upstairs with tiles in the wet areas. The kitchen has a 900mm gas-cook-top, electric oven, dishwasher, breakfast bar, stone bench tops & servery out to the back deck. Huge enclosed man cave under the home great for storage.

The land is 1032 sqm or just over a quarter of an acre. Fenced on three sides. A side gate could easily be installed so you could have a fully fenced yard. Side access to get to the 2 bay shed 8m x 4m out the back with concrete floor. High 2 bay carport out the front and an extra car park beside for your visitors convenience, caravan or boat.
